### **Territorial Acknowledgement**

We acknowledge that we are gathered on land occupied successively by the Wendat-Huron, the Haudenosaunee-Iroquois, and most recently, the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. This territory of the so-called Toronto Purchase is covered by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee and the Ojibwe and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the lands and resources around the Great Lakes. Today, the meeting place of Toronto (from the Haudenosaunee word, Tkaronto) is still the home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island and we are grateful to have the opportunity to live and work and worship in this territory.
